PASTOR'S WORDS For God has not given us a spirit of fear and timidity, but of power, love, and self-discipline" (2 Timothy 1:7 NLT). When God gives us an idea, he gives it in three parts:

First, he says what he's going to do (spoken word), then he says how he's going to do it, and then he gives you the timing.

The biggest mistake people make is getting the first part but forgetting the other two. We take God's idea and go out and try to do it as if he doesn't care how it should be done. We try to do it our way, and we usually fall flat. We don't know the timing, so we try to rush things.

After moving into our previous house (and after living there for almost 6 years), we decided to build a Sugar Shack for processing maple sap into syrup. Right after we poured the concrete for the foundation for it, Kelly learned of an opportunity to relocate back here to the U.P. and we pursued that idea.

God said, "Right idea for the Sugar Shack, but it's the wrong place and wrong time. Don't do it, because I'm not in it." So we changed those plans, built it as an out building, and moved back to the U.P. God blessed us with the right property and after that God said, "Now, here's where you're going," and we built a different Sugar Shack in the woods surrounded by maple trees from rough cut lumber from the property. Looking back on it, I think that the second Sugar Shack turned out better than the first, even though I'm still not

PASTOR'S WORDS done building it and it's been over 8 years since I started it.

How do you know God's timing? God starts bringing all the pieces together. But you have to wait for it! Then, when God says, "Go," you move into action. At that point, you have to take a step of faith.

Taking a step of faith may seem impossible for you today because you're facing a big problem. Maybe you've got some difficult decisions to make. You feel fearful, discouraged, and depressed. Then one morning, a stranger calls and says, "I don't know you, but I understand you're having some problems. I called because I really feel like God wanted me to share this verse with you." Through that person, God gives us a spoken word and reminds us how he is working in our lives.

That verse was 2 Timothy 1:7, and it's a verse some of you need right now. God's promise to you is this: "For God has not given us a spirit of fear and timidity, but of power, love, and self-discipline" (NLT).

God wants to work in all of our lives — that's a thought (logic). But he also wants to work in *your* life with an idea. Does God still do miracles today? You bet he does. But he does them in his timing, according to his sovereign will. Believe that God is working in your life, claim his promise, and move forward with his power!



A: It has been a busy spring and summer so far. We held Vacation Bible School in June, that




